LINGUAL FRENECTOMY USING DIODE LASER- A CASE REPORT

'Ankyloglossia' or tongue tie is a congenital anomaly caused by an abnormally short, tight lingual frenulum resulting in limitation of tongue movement.

'Frenectomy' corresponds to the complete excision of the frenulum.

It can be performed using diode lasers as they are excellent coagulators. Patient can be discharged on the same day with analgesics and oral physiotherapy should be advised. Click below to read more!
